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I write to you today to share my conviction that the process followed (explicitly or implicitly) by the township, region and province in developing the proposal for expropriation of 770 acres of prime farmland in Wilmot Township for industrial development is seriously flawed and needs to be revisited.

My conviction is based on several fundamental beliefs / expectations:

It is my sincere wish that you undertake a review of the whole process of industrial expansion in the region in consultation with residents relative to the desires of the community for such expansion in general as well as the nature and suitable location of any such expansion as may ultimately be sanctioned by the residents / voters that you represent.
