







Q8 In your opinion, how do fireworks benefit our community, if at all?

Screen Name Redacted To date attempts to limit the number of days, hours, and circumstances when fireworks can be used has made little impact. Living near student areas and Waterloo Park there are always fireworks being set off on the days around holidays and outside of the "allowed" hours. There's also plenty of mess left, especially in the park. Even when public fireworks were held in the park there was a lot of mess left in the lake and on the boardwalk, and on at least one occasion resulting in dead wildlife and a blackout. Additionally, every time there are fireworks it's extremely stressful for pets and those with anxiety or PTSD. Switching to drone shows or other options is one way to show kindness, and frankly, they're more interesting. However, even with a ban, the only way for it to actually catalyze change is real enforcement, which there hasn't really been to date. By the time someone calls in a complaint and officers get there, the perpetrators are long gone.

People are already setting off fireworks outside of the permitted Screen Name Redacted windows, and in crowded downtown locations. I have trouble seeing adding more time/day-related restrictions being effective especially since there are fireworks available for sale all year round. I would support a complete ban of private fireworks outside of some public displays at key times of year (though honestly, I wouldn't have any sadness about losing those either, or making them drone displays). I remember how especially frustrating fireworks were when our kids were babies. We hardly got any sleep at all to begin with, and then the fireworks would start and wake up the kids, it felt like torture during those moments, and then you didn't know when they would randomly start in the middle. Of the night again because people have no respect. Babies don't understand fireworks. Animals don't understand them, they're terrified. Surely we can evolve past this by now. There's the risk of fire, of injury, and of mental distress to people and animals. The number of days they're permitted isn't an issue to me (in fact, I find it rather odd that they're not allowed at New Year's, which honestly is probably a safer time for them than Canada Day). But I

	think there should be greater restrictions on private individuals being allowed to purchase and set off fireworks.

Screen Name Redacted	Strongly agree towards a ban of private use fireworks as they are never used properly and can cause serious property damage. They are always reported and then the amount of bylaw officers available is never enough. I have even called 911 because of fireworks being let off inside a garage and they could not respond for two hours!!! UNBELIEVABLE
Screen Name Redacted	If private fireworks sales are permitted, all vendors should be highly regulated, and anyone using fireworks for private events should be absolutely liable for any and all damage caused as a result of such use.
Screen Name Redacted	It is a sad comment to want to ban something that used to be done simply, less often, resposibly, and with care for others, but it seems those criteria are largely ignored. Only public(controlled displays) should be allowed, and NOT at all in fire prone areas.

Screen Name Redacted	Using modern technology such as cameras, drones and other common tools such as eyes and ears, it should be very easy to find and fine people using fireworks irresponsibly. The lack of enforcement is not a matter of fireworks, but a behaviour issue that can be enforced.
Screen Name Redacted	This survey did not mention how fireworks are set off in PUBLIC areas by private groups. For example, people setting off fireworks in Victoria Park. The issue isn't just safety of people setting off fireworks in the privacy of their backyards, the sale of fireworks is allowing people to set them off in places where they can (and have) hurt people beyond themselves. They are a nuisance and need to be completely banned.
Screen Name Redacted	As a person living with PTSD, fireworks are extremely triggering and prevent me from sleeping on nights that there are fireworks. The neighborhood fireworks are the worst.
Screen Name Redacted 1/27/2025 02:05 PM	Please be EXTREMELY cautious with new regulations. Our culture is evolving and with those changes come circumstances with which the common practices of the past are no longer so common. Couple this with a gross imbalance of power between those in position to make changes and those who would be affected by these changes, since the groups responsible for the cultural changes are under- represented on council, and this becomes a potentially explosive situation. This seemingly innocuous change in fireworks regulation has numerous red flags for systemic racism that must be discussed and are glaringly obvious in their absence from this survey, which only serves to increase my level of concern. A lawsuit would not be an unexpected ramification to changes which will almost certainly have a disproportionately larger impact on one culture at the expense of another, primarily affecting a group of people who clearly belong to a visible minority. Caution is warranted. Has input from various cultural groups, in particular those who traditionally use fireworks to celebrate their various cultural and religious traditions, been requested?

Screen Name Redacted	Fireworks are very distressing for both domestic animals and wildlife, and bad for the environment. While I understand that fireworks have a significance in some cultural celebration, both of the above points should take precedence. People can and should find a different way to celebrate, while animals and the environment have no choice.
Screen Name Redacted	I love public fireworks! But, nobody can ignore the destruction of the environment anymore. To continue to allow fireworks, public or private is irresponsible. Education and promotion of alternatives should be key to ALL celebrations that use light. Change takes time and can be hard but we need to be leaders for the environment's sake. Anytime there is a holiday the fireworks go on far longer than needed in the middle of the night. It is frustrating when people need to get up for

work the next day.

I absolutely support the full ban on the sale and use of private fireworks. The existing rules are far too lenient, and when an issue happens, bylaw is never able to get to site on time to catch someone in the act of setting them off, so the rules may as well not exist, because no one gets punished for setting off fireworks at midnight in the middle of a residential area at completely the wrong time of year (something that I experienced on New Year's Eve this year, where several intoxicated young men set off fireworks two houses down, and got belligerent when we asked them to stop because of three sleeping children in our house). There is no reason why people need to set off their own fireworks, especially if the cities/townships/region make sure to run at least two or three big displays on each of the three major holidays where we already expect to hear fireworks. But the amount of disruption should decrease greatly, and safety would improve dramatically. Additionally, we could coordinate this with the new Bird Friendly City designation that Kitchener has, as a way to improve the environment for wildlife, particularly considering the debris that is left behind from fireworks.

Drones are an affordable and more environmental conscious form of celebration. Public drone shows can be done and private fireworks should be banned. Major fines should apply if remnants are found post fireworks.

I love a good public fireworks display. I'm not a huge fan of the private ones in our neighbourhood, mostly because I have a small child and they impact his sleep (and therefore my sleep). I also find that people who set them off often do so in spaces that are too close to trees, structures, people, etc. I think people know you're not allowed to set them off in public parks, but they also don't have any good alternatives - like yards often don't have the required empty space, unless you have a rural property. I know fireworks are important for many cultural events - Dwali for example, and yes, even Canada Day - so I don't agree with banning them completely. I would like to see the Region add additional days / times / locations for public displays, or provide safe, open areas on certain days for people to go and set off their own fireworks. If I know when to expect the noise from fireworks, I can plan ahead with my kid and pets. If people have safe spaces to set them off, it might decrease the number of people doing it at home and potentially causing an injury or a fire. As an example, it's my understanding that Diwali celebrations traditionally involve fireworks, but I'm not aware of a public fireworks display that is timed to coincide with Diwali. It's no wonder then that we see a rash of complaints about private fireworks displays on those dates. I also think it's important to acknowledge that a law that cannot be enforced may as well not exist. One frustration when calling bylaw about nuisance fireworks displays that take place outside of allowed days is that the offence is typically over and done with by the time the bylaw officer shows up. Similarly, we can't expect that teenagers will stop lighting fireworks in parks just because we make doing so illegal. To that end, I think that banning public sale of fireworks is an important measure, as it adds the friction of importing fireworks from elsewhere into the mix. In addition, working with other nearby municipalities to ensure that they also implement a similar ban can help to protect us all.

I note that the Waterloo Bylaw points to the Explosives Act which makes sense from a legal point of view but also means that the Bylaw itself doesn't provide any measurable guidance as to what is allowable. It would be helpful to include characteristics like "maximum 20ft tall". Suggestions: I suggest that City of Waterloo (CoW) consider following the lead of other communities (ex: Brampton) and adopting a simple and outright ban on fireworks while making sure there are City-led events for any maior holidays. enforcement remains problematic. If a ban is not tenable, I suggest CoW consider reducing the number of "allowable days". For reference, CoW bylaw allows at 8 days (before/after/including Victoria Day, before/after/including Canada Day, Diwali, Lunar New Year) CoW could review Bylaws in other significantly multi-cultural communities and follow suit, significantly reducing the number of allowable days: - Kitchener's bylaw on allowable dates - Victoria Day (fireworks are only permitted May 20), Canada Day (fireworks are only permitted July 1), Diwali (fireworks are only permitted November 1) -- outlining a single day where fireworks are permissible. This allows 3 days instead of 8 days in Waterloo. - Toronto allowable dates: Victoria Day, Canada Day - 2 allowable days versus 8 allowable days in Waterloo. - London, ON allowable dates: Victoria Day, Canada Day, Diwali and the Lunar New Year (4 days instead of 89) If there is a permit system in place for other days, I would recommend some mechanism to notify communities where the permit is granted. I would also recommend a nominal fee - \$20, for a private display for example - to ensure the permit attempts to cover the cost of having to permit fireworks. Fireworks are expensive so a permit fee may not be unreasonable. Furthermore, in the context of previous discussions, City staff have cited costs to permit and enforce as making things too expensive (ex: campfires).. maybe a permit fee helps to offset this. In summary - I do enjoy fireworks displays and enjoy professional displays. I find them much more interesting than "drone shows", for example. But I do find that backyard fireworks are often disturbing and for the exclusive enjoyment of a small group of people, but in the earshot/startling everyone else around. If private household fireworks displays continue to be allowed, it would be good if on a long weekend, e.g., Victoria Day weekend, individuals didn't set off fireworks on Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday nights... The regulations specify the Monday holiday only, but I would say that's generally ignored, with people setting off fireworks on whichever night suits their personal schedule best.

The guestions in #13 were all geared to supporting fireworks with Screen Name Redacted more regulation. I want to be clear that I firmly oppose all traditional fireworks. There was no way to respond to those guestions that would capture my position accurately. I wish the guestions had been posed differently. Frankly, no amount of education or regulation will change things much if at all. People selling fireworks are often people who do this outside of a traditional business (such as a physical store). They run roadside stands and make a lot of money selling them. They won't care about regulations; they just want to make money. People buying them don't care either. Every year there are at least two fireworks activities planned in Knollwood Park by longterm community members. The last time I asked someone about it, they did not think anyone needed a permit. They start well before dusk because they want the little kids to see them before bedtime. And they keep going well past 11 pm. Then the rogue people with nothing better to do set them off throughout the night. No one cleans up the mess from the fireworks or the partiers. The Diwali celebrations are never kept to one night, and again they don't stick to the hours pemitted. Whether fireworks are considered part of a cultural or holiday celebration, they're disruptive to residents and harmful to pets, wildlife and people with PTSD. They also put toxic chemicals into the air. There's no good reason to continue this practice. Let's look for environmentally friendly ways to celebrate. Surely there are pyrotechnic or digital alternatives we can explore (Paris did it for the Olympics!). I've called bylaw and police many times when fireworks are being set off very late at night (well after 11 pm) and when I've been walking by Knollwood Park and seen teens setting them off. When you're in your home, it isn't always possible to know where the fireworks are being set off. Of course bylaw isn't available to help late at night, and police are busy. Spending any of our policing budget on fireworks management is wasteful and negligent. Crime has grown a lot in the 32 years I've lived in Kitchener and Waterloo. Our police officers need to be able to focus on serious crimes and on the growing community crimes being committed by nightime crawlers and daytime creeps stealing items from properties, breaking into homes, and stealing mail and packages. Bylaw management needs to be taking care of issues like fireworks and other bylaw infractions -- proactively! Bylaw

management stinks in Kitchener. The officers are nice people, but there's no proactive bylaw management -- everything has to be a response to a complaint. People in my community have reported over and over and over about basketball nets sitting on the boulevards and hanging over the road -- and children playing on the road. As soon as bylaw gives the warning, the equipment gets removed -- but temporarily. No one can do anything if your neighbour has a bright light shining into your home all night. No one cares if your neighbour has a fire pit in their yard and you and other neighbours have to keep your windows closed for at least 24 hours to keep your home from smelling like wood smoke. And no one cares if you are kept up at night by fireworks that keep you from sleeping or that stress out your animals or a person in your home. The Region of Waterloo's bylaw management is no better. They may be empathetic, but they can't seem to do anything about the people who root through our garbage and blue bins day and night. Neighbours and I have reported this activity frequently but now most of us have given up. People drive their nice vehicles into our neighbourhoods, root through our bins, and load up their vehicles with cans and bottles. Then there are the people with bikes and wagons, and the ones walking with shopping carts. And they wake us up while they root through the bins or dump them on the ground; and they make a lot of noise carting around the cans and bottles. How about spending some money teaching people why they shouldn't leave refundable containers in their bins (e.g., that money goes to the waste management organization and helps reduce costs to taxpayers; people who genuinely need help are better served when we donate money to non-profit organizations that can provide appropriate support; communities are safer when we don't have outsiders walking our streets going through our things). While I appreciate the opportunity to participate in this survey, I have little confidence that the leaders at city hall will do the right thing for the community and our environment. It's a city that likes to say that bylaws exist to make this a comfortable city for all; but the reality is our leaders want to ignore most things unless there's a real uproar. I appreciate the opportunity to share my views on fireworks and other topics I've touched on. I will likely end up leaving a city that I love. I will miss it here for many, many reasons; but it's become an increasingly uncomfortable place to live and thrive.
