**Dear Honourable Doug Ford, MPP Harris, Karen Redman and Councillors, Mayor Armstrong and Councillors of Wilmot Township,**

**(Please include this in the public record)**

**We write to you to draw your attention to an issue that is deeply troubling to residents in Wilmot Township where Petersburg Sand Company Inc. IBI, has requested a zone change from the council of Wilmot Township. The objective is to access more aggregate. Residents in Wilmot Township have overwhelmingly expressed our collective concerns about the cumulative impacts of over harvesting practices in Wilmot Township and the health and the environmental impacts and we expect the elected officials in Wilmot to vehemently oppose this zone change request and defend this position. This proposed application will further impact air quality, water conservation and wildlife habitats. Wilmot Township council has unanimously voted to endorse a moratorium on aggregate extraction, declared an Environmental Emergency, Supported the fifty by thirty environmental declaration.**

**The residents of Wilmot expect the council to uphold these commitments.**

**Wilmot councillors are duty bound to protect our drinking water and its supply. I expect councillors to uphold this and protect private wells.**

**We question why the company sought to impose the attendant risks and loss of wetlands, community road safety of Snyder's Road and the quiet settlement area of Petersburg for another several decades should this aggregate application be successful.**

**The community has several *Bus Stops* on Snyder's Road and the haul route of this aggregate operation will increase the threat to children's safety in our community.**

**Chair Redman, the taxpayers of the Wilmot Township have paid for bike lanes, and road repair. How is allowing this supporting and protecting our investment .**

**From our perspective, the desire for profit to be made is more important to the company than the preservation of an invaluable resource of prime agriculture farm land to the growing communities of Wilmot Township.**

**Premier Ford, we hope it is as clear to you as it is to us that the company is proceeding on a false premise in proposing to continue quarrying aggregate at this site. The precautions and undertakings that it is offering would be appropriate if the resource it wishes to exploit were of critical importance to the safety or security of the community at large. In such a case, citizens would accept the risks in the interests of meeting the Province's vital requirements for the product. But that is not the case here.**

**The site in Petersburg is a terrible location for an activity as destructive and disruptive as aggregate extraction and trucking it away, threat to the water table and driving wildlife away from wetlands.**

**This is not a case of NIMBYism. It supports a rich environment of deer, owls, bald eagles, grouse, wild turkeys, numerous species of waterfowl, and songbirds.**

**Wilmot Council, you have publicly committed to preserve the greenbelt properties in the Golden Horseshoe to the extent reasonably practicable. That does not mean that every opposing plea will be granted. But, please consider: this area has paid its dues on this activity by living with the aggregate extraction without rehabilitation and are still living with cumulative impacts for decades.**

**Environments are vanishingly scarce in this area now, Our children, their children, or their children's children. Persons forming the fourth generation following might see some benefit, perhaps, if the environment recovers and the wildlife return.**

**We respectfully request – urge you – to acknowledge the contribution that this community has made to the development of the Province's infrastructure and development and tolerating the disruption and damage while awaiting the end of the disruptive activity in Wilmot Township. Please do not let crass considerations of low-cost transport to market be the key factor in your decision whether to accept the company's proposal. Protect this sensitive environment; protect the prime farm lands and the health and safety for the people of the area and the surrounding communities. Please stop this zone change - NOW.**
